Peter was warming himself by a charcoal fire in the high priest's courtyard when he denied three times that he even knew Christ. Now, sitting around a charcoal fire where Christ has prepared their breakfast, the risen Christ asks Peter three times, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?"

Is Jesus giving Peter a chance to redeem himself? That certainly would fit Jesus method of operation. Jesus was always calling people to new life, increased faith, a different way of being, a renewed sense of calling. Peter was certainly a fallible individual, but then, aren't we all? It would be just like the risen Christ to come to Peter once again, upon whom he said he would build his Church, and secure the foundation upon which this institution would be built. Jesus reminds Peter of his divine calling, to "tend his sheep," which is every believer's divine calling as well.
